
# Register Now for the Safe and Supportive Schools Conference January 22, 2016


# Workshops on a variety of topics will be held throughout the day, including:

- Working with children and adolescents who bully.
- Supporting students in bullying situations with practical solutions.
- Being safe on social media, including "social reporting" presented by Facebook.
- Addressing gender identity-based bullying.
- Bullying involving students with disabilities.
- Addressing the biases behind bullying.
- Examining restorative practices in schools.
- Using the Minnesota School Survey data to create youth profiles of developmental skills, supports and challenges.
- Bullying prevention and intervention projects done by youth.

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The U.S. Department of Education Office of Safe and Healthy Students Director David Esquith will deliver the keynote "The Challenges, Emerging Issues, and Promising Practices in Improving School Climate" to open the conference. American Institutes of Research Vice President David Osher, an expert in creating safe and supportive schools, will speak in the afternoon.
