Video title: Together Against Bullying

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Classroom Discussion Questions

1. The video shows several drawings of the world. It also includes the line:

“Bullying is hurting too many people in this world.”

- Do you think bullying is a worldwide issue? If yes, why?
- Do you think bullying is the same in the United States as in other countries? And if yes, why?

2. A powerful way to address bullying is for students to support other students.* This video includes the line:

“tall, short skinny or round, you have a voice, so make a sound, never meant to be the same.”

- What does this line mean to you?
- What are some things each person can do to help stop bullying? What are things you can do to be supportive of someone who is being bullied?

3. It's important to share information about bullying to ensure all students know they have the right to be safe at school.

- What are ways to talk about bullying in the classroom?
- With the entire school?

4. In the video, there is a line:

“you have to care.”

- Why is it important that we all try to prevent bullying from happening?
- How do you think it feels to be bullied?
- How would school be a better place without bullying?
- How would those who are impacted by bullying do better if they knew they could go to school without being hurt, harmed, or teased?

**More than half of bullying situations (57 percent) stop when a peer intervenes on behalf of the student being bullied. (Hawkins, Pepler, and Craig, 2001)*
