



Initial Considerations for Parents of Students with Disabilities: Choosing a Charter School – Parent Checklist

Parents report that there are many unknowns when choosing a charter school. For example, you may want to know how long the school has been open, if the staff is appropriately licensed, and if their child will receive the necessary learning supports to succeed. Think about your child's specific needs and how they learn best. It will help you make the decision whether to enroll your child in a charter school, and consider whether the charter school program is a good fit for your child.
