# **Brief Outline for Student AIM Acquisition**

- Student consideration process regarding AIM (not necessarily in this order)
  - o Determination of need
  - Selection of formats
    - Tasks
    - Environments
    - Preferences, skills, needs
  - Acquisition of formats
  - Selection of supports for use
    - Assistive Technology
    - Accommodations and/or modifications
    - Training (both student and staff)
    - Support staff
    - Repair and upgrade

- Find the appropriate source(s) to match: the student's needed format(s) & student's qualifications (work with Digital Rights Manager (DRM) if available)
  - o If applicable, register the student with the source(s)
- Search the source(s) for the students needed books and download/request for student (work with Digital Rights Manager (DRM) if available)
  - If book is not found in the Accessible Media Producer (AMP) source's inventory, search the NIMAC repository; if found, request the file from appropriate Authorized User (AU)
    - If book is not found in NIMAC repository, then some AMPs may accept requests to add books to their inventory
- If books are not available through existing sources:
  - Contact publisher to request accessible format if available
  - Locally create an accessible format in compliance of Fair Use of Copyrighted materials

### • NIMAC (National Instructional Materials Access Center)

- o Requirements regarding print related disability and IDEA
- A repository for NIMAS file sets of textbooks and related instructional materials purchased after 2006
  - File sets not yet in a specialized format not student ready
  - Publishers will deposit NIMAS compliant files to the NIMAC if Local Education Agencies include wording for this request in their book purchase agreements.
  - Must contact an Authorized User to request a book from the NIMAC

- Eligibility: student who has a certified & qualifying print related disability <u>and</u> is served under IDEA with an IEP

- Locally Created
  - o Proceed in compliance with Copyright Law: Fair Use
  - Convert printed materials into electronic text by scanning materials with an OCR scanner and/or scan & read program
  - Further Creation of Specialized Formats:
    - Text to audio conversion
      - Convert electronic text into an audio file using synthesized speech
    - Modify/customize visual display of text
      - Print or read via computer or electronic device
    - Convert to Braille
      - Embossed Braille/ hardcopy Braille
      - Read etext/digital Braille with a Refreshable Braille Device
